Teachers

All of Field's K-5 classroom teachers & 3 additional staff are fully certified, and the Mandarin language teachers also have or are working towards an additional BCLAD (Bilingual Cross-cultural, Language and Academic Development) certificate. Additional resources include: Part-time Nurse, Full-time Health Clerk, Music teacher, Speech/Language & Resource specialists. Community Assistant serves as Library Coordinator.

NOTE: Enrollment at Field is through Open Enrollment only, with preference given to applicants from the immediate neighborhood. Out-of-district families can submit an application of interest. Students apply as either Native Mandarin-speakers or non-Native speakers. (Entry to the program is at kinder only, unless the student can demonstrate proficiency in the target language.) Students can choose to continue in the Mandarin-English DLIP at Sierra Madre Middle School, and then at Pasadena High School.

Field: What has changed recently? A new principal was assigned to the school in Fall 2020.

School Environment / Social-Emotional Learning

Mission: The mission of Field Elementary School is to provide its students with a safe and supportive environment in which all of their academic, social, and emotional needs can be met. Field seeks to produce effective and responsible citizens who will be complex thinkers, quality producers, collaborative workers, self-directed learners, and community contributors.

Positive Recognition: Students earn Positive Person Award tickets, with ten students recognized each week. Two students from each classroom receive a Student-of-the-Month and Character award. Students who have made a considerable effort to grow in an area and who have shown a consistent desire to continue improving and making progress toward a goal are awarded the "Go Getter" award each semester. Students also receive Citizenship, Math, Science, Reading, Physical Education and Art awards as well as Honor Roll recognition and "Field's Finest" award which is given to one student in each class who has performed academically and also has been a model student and citizen throughout the year.
