

Principal

Lori Touloumian became Marshall's principal in 2021. She previously served as principal for the Eliot Arts Magnet middle school, as an assistant high school principal, and as coordinator for the Districtwide Magnet program. Assistant Principals: Audrey Green (Activities/Student Services); Lanisha Kelly McKenzie (Guidance/Discipline); and Sandra Rizzo (currently on assignment as San Rafael's interim principal).

Teachers/Staff

Classroom teachers are all credentialed, and most also have a single-subject credential. A number of teachers have been recognized as Rotary of Pasadena Teachers of Excellence. Other credentialed staff include academic counselors, an instructional coach, response to intervention (behavioral) coach, 3 school psychologists, a clinical social worker, and a full-time librarian.

PUSD will post the range of open enrollment seats projected to be available for the 2024-2025 school year in January 2023. Families are encouraged to rank all schools they would prefer to their assigned school of residence in order of preference, regardless of OE seat projections, and to opt in to the 2nd lottery if they do not get their preferred school in the first lottery.

Marshall has been recognized repeatedly by US News & World Report, the California Department of Education, and other institutions recognizing excellence in education. It received the 2021 California Exemplary Arts Award, the was the only California high school to receive the 2018 Civic Learning Award of Excellence.

Marshall employs one full time Language Development Resource Teacher who works with English Language Learners. There are 23 instructional aides. Marshall has The Academy for Creative Industries (ACI) and Puente Programs for high school.

School Environment

Student Recognition/Leadership Opportunities: The Evening of Excellence recognizes students each semester with a 3.5 GPA and higher, as well as, students with perfect attendance. Marshall has over 50 clubs, High School and Middle School Associated Student Body (ASB) and the Middle School WEB Crew offering opportunities for leadership development.

Security: 6 full time security guards, in addition to response-to-intervention (RTI) coaches

Uniform/Dress Code: Appropriate dress required

Middle School Schedule, Electives & Enrichment

6th **Grade Class Configuration:** 6th graders are self-contained, with a common PE period, plus an elective/intervention period as part of the 6-period day. Middle school lunch (grades 6-8) is separate from high school lunch.

Electives: Grades 6-8: Art, ASB (student leadership) Band, Choir, Coding, Dance (PE), Orchestra & Spanish; electives available at 7th & 8th grade: Drama, Robotics 8th grade only. Qualified students may also take a World Language: American Sign Language, Mandarin, or Spanish

Opportunities for Advanced Students: Honors classes in all subjects; grades, SBAC (state testing), and teacher recommendations considered in placement to ensure that honors classes are accessible to as many students as possible. Honors (AP Prep) classes – students can expect to cover more materials and have more homework than in a general education class. Marshall offers a variety of courses that incorporate the varying academic needs of students. Courses are layered to provide intervention and strategic instruction in literacy and math; as well as AP Prep and Advanced Placement.

Opportunities for Academic Intervention: Students needing intervention work in small groups and can rejoin an elective class once caught up.

Clubs and Activities: Art; Chess; Cultural Clubs (Black Student Union, Armenian Club, Uniditos); Dr. Who; Girls Club, Leadership (ASB), and WEB Crew (Where Everybody Belongs – 8th Grade Mentors).

Athletic Program: Through the LEARNS program.
